Ministerial conference on nutrition and NCDs

According to estimates, around 34.5 million people died from non-communicable diseases in 2010, that is 65% of all deaths. Inadequate nutrition and a lack of physical exercise are amongst the main causes for this high proportion.

Against this background, a WHO Ministerial Conference on the role of nutrition in the prevention of NCDs was held at the Hofburg in Vienna on July 4 and 5, 2013. Christina Dietscher from the Vienna WHO-CC attended as an observer.

The meeting was opened by WHO Regional Director Zsuzsanna Jakab and the Austrian Minister of Health Alois Stöger. Delegates from 48 countries discussed national strategies for improving the nutritional situation of their citizens. There was consensus on the need for public health measures in this regard, since it was broadly acknowledged that nutrition-related lifestyles cannot be changed merely by providing information and education. Rather, the examples presented and recommended included legal regulations for reducing saturated fats, sugar and salt in nutritional products, the prohibition of certain ingredients, as well as specific regulations for public canteens such as those in schools or worksites.

The meeting concluded with the launch of the Vienna Declaration on Nutrition and Non-Communicable Diseases. The document calls a.o. for a reduction of nutrition-related advertising to children, and for the exertion of influence on food choices by fiscal regulations.

Health systems and services can have important roles in implementing the declaration e.g. by promoting healthy nutrition during pregnancy, by promoting breastfeeding according to WHO recommendations, and by supporting adequate nutrition in the growing group of older citiziens, e.g. by routinely assessing the nutritional status of older patients.

Another option to tackle nutrition in hospital settings is by giving consideration to the contents of hospital food vending machines (see related article at BBC Health: http://www.bbc.co.uk/news/health-23631368)

The conference which was titled "Best investments for health" took place from August 25-29, 2013, in Pattaya, Thailand. Around 1800 participants from around the globe participated in the successful event.

There was a conference session organized by the HPH network, titled "Global teaching, training and capacity building in the international HPH network", and numerous other conference sessions covered diverse issues of relevance to health promotion in healthcare, including the role of health professionals in health promotion, health promotion in primary care, health literacy, healthcare for older people, NCD prevention, and women's health.

HPH representatives, including the chair of the HPH governance board Dr. Shu-Ti Chiou, GB member Dr. Sally Fawkes, technical officer Thor Bern Jensen from the Copenhagen, WHO-CC, and Prof. Jürgen Pelikan, director of the Vienna WHO-CC, also had numerous other roles at the conference, including contributions to workshops and plenary sessions.

News from HPH Networks, Task Forces and Members



We had the honor of being among the three networks nominated for the HPH Award 2013 on the occasion of the international HPH General Assembly on May 22, 2013, in Gothenburg. The nomination was related to our activities 2011-2013. This is a great satisfaction that strengthens us as a group. And we would like to extend our congratulations to the network in Taiwan that finally won the prize.

We would now like to summarize some of the most significant areas of work of the Friuli Venezia Giulia network during the last years. It seems that we became resilient as a network during these years despite the ongoing economic crisis.

In relation to HPH standard 4 – Promoting a Healthy Workplace - we carried out a self-assessment of psycho-emotional wellbeing, by using a form that was to be applied in synergy with standards 1 and 4 of the HPH Manual. The aim was to encourage the performance of self-assessments of work-related stress risks without necessarily waiting for these to be legally demanded (Decree with Force in Law 81/2008). The focus on psycho-emotional wellbeing generally supports organizational empowerment. It aims to promote protective factors instead of focusing on risk factors and can be integrated into managerial strategies that aim at monitoring the risks for work-related stress. Of course this strategy is part of the setting-based approach of our member organizations, aiming at creating supportive environments that promote healthy lifestyles for their staff.

With regard to standard 1 – Management Policy – we felt the need to consolidate the multiprofessional culture that is predominant in healthcare so as to facilitate, for example, the selection of conference contributions from various disciplines by scientific committees. For this purpose, we developed three evaluation forms, available in the download section at www.retehphfvg.it, which should allow standardizing the working methods of evaluation committees. In fact, there are many different topics in health promotion, and specific

know-how is required to fully understand the value of a given project. In our forms we focus on the priorities that we expect to be immediately developed – empowerment, networks and alliances. We also ran several regional and local training courses to implement and sustain the new working methods.

To enhance the impact of HPH on Health Planning in the Friuli Venezia Giulia region, our strategies were presented to organizational leaders with the aim to support the integration of the HPH tools into the lines of management and health planning. The Regional Plan for Prevention 2010-2012 acknowledges the value of the HPH network.

In recent years we won many international and national awards. Nationally, these represent the continued enthusiasm and push that we continuously give each other as a network. Currently there are 7 organizations in the network, a heterogeneous mix of university hospitals, general hospitals, community health services and integrated services.



From September 30 to October 1, 2013, the Estonian HPH network, coordinated by Dr. Tiiu Härm, will hold a HPH Autumn school. The event will be cohosted by the Bureau of Health Promotion (BHP), Department of Health, Taiwan, which is headed by Dr. Shu-Ti Chiou (chair, HPH governance board). The aim of the school is to promote the application of HPH tools, health promotion in mental health settings, age-friendly health care, cancer screening and smoking cessation in health promoting hospitals. Lecturers and participants from Taiwan, Germany, Finland, Lithuania, Latvia and Estonia will contribute to the program and support sharing and learning from "Good practice" examples and experiences in the implementation of health promotion in hospitals and health services.
